

On Monday, February 15, 2021, our **8th graders** will return to school for in-person learning 4 days a week, Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Wednesdays will continue to be an at-home virtual learning day.

On that same date, **grades 9-12** will return to school for in-person learning on the hybrid schedule.

Students that are designated as A students will attend in-person on Mondays and Tuesdays with virtual at-home learning occurring on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays.

Students designated as B students will learn at-home virtually on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays. B students will attend in-person on Thursdays and Fridays.

The hybrid schedule will continue for high school students through March 26, 2021.

Just a few reminders and considerations:

- Masks are required on the bus and in school.
- Breakfast and lunches from the school cafeterias are free for all students.
- The Transportation Department has mailed out bus information; please check with them if you have any questions.
- We encourage parents to drive students to and from school to keep the buses from being overcrowded. Masks and air flow are our only mitigating strategies to prevent COVID19. We cannot promise social distancing on the bus.
- With the increase of vehicles it is very important that drivers follow signs and personnel when dropping off or picking up students. Allow for extra time and we ask for your continued patience.
 - At The Gereau Center, please use the first entry into the teacher parking lot to drop off your child(ren) if they are a car rider. Those who ride the bus will be shuttled to The Gereau Center from BFMS.
- FCHS will be mailing A/B day student schedules this week. Schedules will also be available in the first period either on Monday (A) or Thursday (B).

We look forward to the academic, social and emotional growth of all our students, virtual and in-person, during the second semester.
